	amenities with growing practices, and cocreates eco-
	living experiences with stakeholders. The great
	enthusiasm and drive of the house's occupants to
	synergise with the research team will consolidate eco-
	living initiatives with cultural elements to furthering
	conservation endeavours beyond the target site.
	In future, the project team aims to follow on from Phases
	I & II and further develop integrated conservation
	initiatives in Phase III, so as to regenerate Kuk Po's diverse
	landscape (from Valley to Plain), evolving transformations

	of its historical development (cultural heritage and living traditions) and human-nature symbiosis (ecoliving and environmental management).
